From Oakland; Born circa 1890 & died after full day racing in England 4-5-27; Kentucky Derby Champ 11; Went abroad when California law banned racing 1910-33 & rode more than 1,000 mounts in Europe & England, including many steeplechase races; father of George William Archibald, steeplechase jockey & race horse trainer

Grew up Oakland; born Alameda County 3-31-1890 & died Hayward 11-7-44; PCL Port Beavers 11, SF Seals 12-14, Oakl Oaks 17-20

Edwin Arlett Baseball Pitcher/Infielder
Grew up in East Bay; born Alameda County 3-29-11 & died Alameda 11-15-68; PCL Oakl Oaks 30; son of Alex "Pop" Arlett, see above, & nephew of Russell "Buzz" Arlett, see Fremont High (A)

Jacob "Buddy" Baer Boxing Heavyweight
Attended school in Livermore, but level unknown; Born 6-11-15 & died in Martinez Veterans' Hospital 7-18-86. Pro boxer 34-42 (52-7-0, 46 KOs); Acted in 17 movies including "Quo Vadis" & "The Big Sky"

Maxmillian "Max" Baer Boxing Heavyweight
"The Livermore Larruper"; Born Omaha 2-11-09, but grew up in Hayward & Livermore. Conflicting reports that he either dropped out of school after eighth grade or attended freshman year of high school (which may have been in Hayward); Pro boxer 29-41 (71-13-0, 50 KOs, including

8-25-30 KO where Frankie Campbell died from brain concussion); World Champ 364 days 34-35; boxing & wrestling referee; fought Lou Nova of Alameda High (A), in first tv heavyweight bout 39; actor in 20 movies, including "The Prizefighter and the Lady," and "The Harder They Fall"; Max Baer parks in Livermore and Sacramento named in his honor; portrayed unfairly in movie "Cinderella Man"; #22 in Ring Magazine's 50 Greatest Heavyweights of All-Time; #22 in Ring Magazine's 100 Greatest Punchers of All-Time; BASHOF; Boxing HOF; International Boxing HOF; World Boxing HOF; Greater Oakland Boxing HOF; Tri-Valley HOF; father of actor Max Baer Jr.; brother of Jacob "Buddy" Baer, see above
